

First Lesson:

John 11:43-48, 53

When he had said this, he cried with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" "The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth, and his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them, "Unbind him, and let him go." "Many of the Jews therefore, who had come with Mary and had seen what Jesus did, believed in him. "But some of them went to the Pharisees and told them what he had done. "So the chief priests and the Pharisees called a meeting of the council, and said, "What are we to do? This man is performing many signs. "If we let him go on like this, everyone will believe in him, and the Romans will come and destroy both our holy place and our nation." "So from that day on they planned to put him to death.

Second Lesson:

John 11:1-6

Now a certain man was ill, Lazarus of Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. ² Mary was the one who anointed the Lord with perfume and wiped his feet with her hair; her brother Lazarus was ill. ² So the sisters sent a message to Jesus, "Lord, he whom you love is ill." ⁴ But when Jesus heard it, he said, "This illness does not lead to death; rather it is for God's glory, so that the Son of God may be glorified through it." ⁵ Accordingly, though Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, ⁶ after having heard that Lazarus was ill, he stayed two days longer in the place where he was.
