

# First Lesson: Psalm 101 (p. 552 OT) <sup>4</sup> I will sing of loyalty and of justice; to you, O Lord, I will sing. <sup>2</sup> I will study the way that is blameless. When shall I attain it? I will walk with integrity of heart within my house; <sup>4</sup> I will not set before my eyes anything that is base. I hate the work of those who fall away; it shall not cling to me. <sup>4</sup> Perverseness of heart shall be far from me; I will know nothing of evil. <sup>5</sup> One who secretly slanders a neighbor I will destroy. <sup>•</sup>As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. <sup>•</sup>If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. <sup>•</sup>I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete. <sup>•</sup>"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. <sup>•</sup>No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. <sup>•</sup>You are my friends if you do what I command you. <sup>•</sup>I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. <sup>•</sup>You did not choose me but I chose you. 
